The Best Western Crystal Palace Hotel is located in Turin in via Nizza 11, zip code 10125.

The hotel staff has been trained and is aware of the characteristics of people with autism spectrum disorders, their special needs and how to make the hotel fully inclusive.

Check-In and Check-Out

The hall of the **Best Western Crystal Palace Hotel** is developed in length, there are tables and armchairs for waiting time, a crystal floor in the center, various plants and paintings with dark colors and abstract patterns.

Behind the reception desk there is a television that broadcasts information and videos of Turin. The access door to the hotel is sliding with a photocell.

The hall is not very large, there could be moments of great turnout with consequent increase in waiting times and possible crowding with sensory overload.

The busiest times:

- 1. from 8 to 11
- 2. from 12 to 15

It is therefore advisable to check-in and check-out outside those hours. These hours may vary during events.

The hotel is always open.

Bedroom

The rooms dedicated to customers with ASD have a series of features that can **help** in case of **abnormal sensory reactivity**:

- 1. Non-neon and soft light
- 2. Room far from noise sources
- 3. Use of cleaning detergents with neutral fragrance
- 4. No air fresheners

The **bed linen** is white. The duvet is available to guests. If the guest has special needs, he or she can bring a **blanket or pillow** and the staff will arrange the bed.

The windows overlook the internal courtyard or the street. The windows open completely and are equipped with blackout curtains. There is a minibar with 500 ml bottles of water, a sweet snack, a savory snack and drinks. There is a kettle with two cups and an assortment of herbal teas and instant coffee. There is a vertical mirror.

There are rooms with bathtubs and rooms with showers, not all rooms have bathrooms with windows. Each request is subject to availability.

Room service can be requested at 615 until 12 noon.

Please contact the front desk at 9 for any assistance needs.

Information on TV channels, recommended restaurants, and minibar prices is available on a QR code placed on the desk.

In the room there is material available in alternative augmentative communication regarding:

- 1. Breakfast menu
- 2. Rules of conduct
- 3. Communication tables

Breakfast Room

The breakfast room is located on the top floor with a panoramic view.

A table will be reserved in an area without elements of sensory disturbance, away from the passage of many people.

The breakfast room hours are:

- 1. From 7 to 10, Monday to Friday
- 2. From 8 to 11, Saturday, Sunday and holidays

The time with the greatest influx of customers and therefore possible sensory overload is from 7 to 8.

Piped music is kept at a very low volume.

In the room there is a breakfast menu with the symbols of alternative augmentative communication.



Hotel Information

Transport:

- 1. Porta Nuova train station: exit the station on the Via Nizza side, the hotel is 200m away.
- 2. Sandro Pertini di Caselle Airport 20 km away. Take the "Arriva" shuttle at the airport and get off at the terminus in Piazza Carlo Felice in front of the **Porta**Nuova railway station.
- 3. Metro: the closest stop to our hotel is Porta Nuova inside the train station.

Points of interest:

- Egyptian Museum: 1 km from our hotel, it is renowned for the importance of some of the most important artworks in the world.
- 2. National Cinema Museum of Turin: inside the Mole Antonelliana, symbol of the city, is 1.7 km from the hotel.
- 3. Automobile Museum: 3.5 km from the hotel, only 6 metro stops away.
